# About Disability & Work

**MYTH #1: If I go to work, I will lose my health care coverage.**

**FACT: As long as you keep receiving a cash benefit of any amount, you will keep your health insurance.**

**MYTH #2: If I go to work, SSA will perform a Continuing Disability Review on me and I will lose my benefits.**

**FACT: If you use your Ticket to help you return to work and you are progressing toward your goal, SSA CANNOT perform a Continuing Disability Review.**

**MYTH #3: If I go to work and my benefits stop, then if I get sick again I will have a hard time getting back on benefits.**

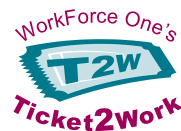
**FACT: SSA Expedited Reinstatement can allow an individual to receive benefits while a new claim is being processed.**

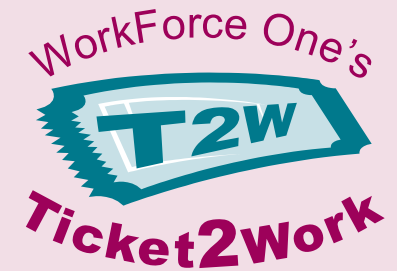

# Tell me about Ticket to Work (T2W)

The T2W program provides Social Security beneficiaries real choices in obtaining the services and resources they need to find and maintain employment, while providing a safety net to help them during this transition.

Since you are considering work, it is important you know what options are available to you:

- Are you eligible for T2W?
- Where is an approved Employer Network (EN) for you?

## Who is eligible for T2W?

Social Security Administration (SSA) determines which Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) beneficiaries are eligible to receive Tickets to Work.

Individuals, ages 18 through 64, who receive either SSI or SSDI may qualify for Ticket to Work (T2W).

Tickets are mailed to individuals receiving benefits. Since T2W is a voluntary program, you can hold onto your ticket and use it when you choose.

## Choose WF1 to be your EN
